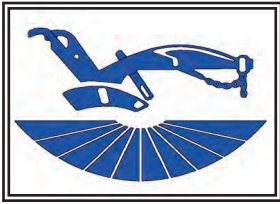

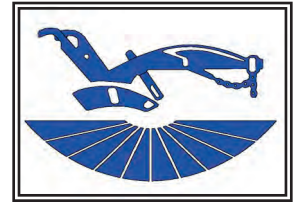

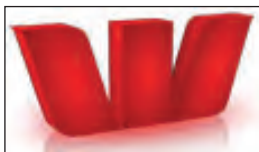

## NZPA – Executive News

75<sup>th</sup> World Ploughing Contest 2028 Site in New Zealand- Over lockdown a subcommittee held several Zoom meetings to discuss the Expression of Interest. There were 33 factors that were discussed. The subcommittee ranked the factors from 1-5 before coming to a decision.

It was decided to recommend to the executive that Lake Hawea was the preferred site for the 2028 World Ploughing Contest.

The executive accepted the subcommittee's recommendation that Lake Hawea be the preferred site and thanked all other Expressions of Interest.

Container- a 40 ft container has been donated by an anonymous donor to the NZPA to be used by the ploughmen travelling overseas. It may be available for hire by NZPA plough persons if not in use for overseas competitors.

## Obituaries

Collie Hurst, Helen Bennie, Alex Furniss, Allan Blair, Pat Dugan, Mait Horrell, Patricia Munro (Paul Murphy's sister) Ailish Tracey (wife of Eamonn).

### Collie Hurst

With the passing of Collie Hurst the ploughing fraternity has lost the last surviving member of the original NZPA Executive which was formed in 1956. Collie served on the Executive between 1956 & 1975 and was President in 1962. In 1975 Collie was Manager for David Brown at the World Ploughing Contest in Canada. For many years before joining the Executive, Collie was a member & Secretary of The Papakaio Ploughing Association. This Association went into recess & combined with the Waimate Ploughing Association to form the present Waitaki PMA. Collie continued his interest in all ploughing matters. Collie was awarded Honorary Life Membership of the NZPA in 1984.

### ALLAN HARROP BLAIR 1929 – 2020



The Taieri Ploughing Match Assn acknowledges the passing of a longtime committee member, judge, and ploughman Allan first ploughed in the 1948 Taieri Ploughing Match, about a year after leaving high school. This was the first TPMA match to be held after WW2. He always ploughed with his favorite 3 furrow plough and ploughed in the 3 furrow class till about 1970.

When the Silver Plough Contest was created around 1956, Allan lost no time in moving into that class. He qualified for the NZ finals 4 times from 1957 Lincoln, 1958 Invercargill, Hastings 1959, Timaru 1960. After that he went back to the 3 furrow class.

After around 1970, Allan moved more towards judging at local matches and NZ finals until approx 2000.

Allan was made Honorary Life member of TPMA in 2013.

The wider Blair family were strong supporters of ploughing, with 2 NZ finals and the 1994 World Ploughing Contest being held on their Abbotsford Farm, as well as some local matches. The 1994 Cairn of Peace sits firmly at the gateway into the Blair Family Abbotsford Farm.

Allan was a noted Border Leicester breeder, entering sheep in A&P shows around the South Island. He served on the Border Leicesters Breeders Committee from 1983 -2007.

Allan served on both the Taieri A&P Society and Otago A&P Society, becoming President of both societies at different times. He was life member of both societies, life member of Royal Agricultural Society, and also awarded the RAS Gold Medal for national service

He was also charter member and past President of Taieri Lions.

Allan and Cecily moved into Taieri Court rest home in 2016. Cecily passed away two years ago.

## Alex Furniss 18 May 1944 – 11 April 2020



Alex passed away peacefully at home in Masterton on 11 April this year after being diagnosed with a terminal illness 18 months earlier. He coped with his illness without fuss and if anyone asked him how he was, his pet phrase was 'I'm just chugging along'.

He was a husband, father, grandfather, a farmer and a community man (Lions, school committees etc). He was also a JP but retired last year because of his health. Apart from his family, his greatest enjoyment came from being involved in the ploughing family and in ploughing competitions as a judge and on the NZPA executive. His first wife Pam was also very involved in various roles on the Executive and at competitions.

Alex was a no fuss person. He would see a job that needed doing and he would do it – without fanfare. I believe he earned the respect of everyone who knew him, with

his quiet and capable ways.

I am grateful to have met Alex, proud to have become his second wife, and to have become part of the ploughing family.

We sent Alex off with this message.

May your plough always be sharp  
and your furrow straight.

## **Chynoweth is of Cornish origin (England) and means “new house”.**

I spent my early years at Pukeroro, halfway between Hamilton and Cambridge and grew up on my parents' stud Friesian farm. At secondary school I excelled at athletics and represented New Zealand secondary schools at hurdling. After attending Lincoln College, I spent 2 years as a Farm Advisor and 3 years share milking at Taupiri and Gordonton. With my late wife Liz, I purchased a farm near Longbeach Mid Canterbury and farmed there for 21 years and also leased a part of Longbeach Estate. We cropped 385ha, ploughing the majority every year. Then came a shift south to Waimate and then Enfield and Kakanui in North Otago.

Sharon grew up in South Otago and has always had a love for horses. From an early age Sharon excelled at barrel racing, A&P shows, one day events, Western riding and Dressage. She is a very accomplished sewing machinist and was the foreman in a sewing factory until the change in economics brought about the demise of the industry. She then farmed and trained horses near Owaka.

After the loss of both our partners, we met while I was South Island Club Captain for the Vintage Car Club. We have travelled extensively throughout New Zealand in cars which we have restored (1918 Buick, 1927 Buick and 1924 Summit). All mechanical work including white metalling, gearbox and diff overhauls, painting, upholstering and hood making etc has been carried out by ourselves.

After Sharon purchased a Clydesdale colt, I suggested that I would be interested in match ploughing with the horses. Then came the search for more horses and a plough. The ground was that hard in North Otago that I couldn't get the 3 wheeler single furrow plough in the ground, and that's how we ended up with the long handle plough as it went in. After some help from Bob Allan we were ready to attend our first match at Hinds in 2015, and ploughed at our first final at Rongotea (2016) representing Otago. We shifted to Oxford in 2017.

## Anzac biscuits

1 ¼ cup rolled oats  
1 ¼ cup plain flour  
1 ¼ cup desiccated coconut  
1 cup caster sugar  
150 g butter chopped  
2 tbsp golden syrup  
1 tsp van essence  
1 ¼ tsp bicarbonate of soda  
2 tbsp boiling water



Place oats, flour, coconut and sugar in a large bowl, stir to combine. Stir butter, syrup and vanilla in a small saucepan over a low heat till melted. Dissolve the soda in boiling water. Stir into the butter mix. Pour butter mix over oat mix and stir till well mixed. Roll a spoon full of mix into a ball and slightly flatten on a tray lined with baking paper. Cook in a moderately slow oven for about 15-20 mins till golden brown. Stand for 10 mins to cool on tray.
